

Regulations for study programmes and examinations in special and extraordinary situations

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Basis

The measures decreed by the federal government and the canton of Graubünden for control of the coronavirus (COVID-19).

I. General provisions

- Art. 1
Object ¹ These regulations serves to ensure the continuation of study programmes and examination in special and extraordinary situations by overriding parts of the existing regulations.
- Art. 2
Scope ¹ These regulations apply to teaching and further education. The articles shall apply analogously to further education.
² These regulations shall apply from 14 September 2020 until 20 Februar 2021 (Autumn semester 2020).
- Art. 3
Responsibility ¹ The University Executive Board implements the regulations in accordance with their scope and informs the members of the university immediately.

II. Module description/Semester information

- Art. 4
Adjustment of the module description/semester information ¹ The module description/semester information can be adjusted by the director of studies up to two weeks before the end of face-to-face classes according to the university calendar of the respective semester. The students shall be informed of the adjustment in writing.
² If the module description/semester information or the transcript of records is adjusted, students can deregister from the respective module without consequences.

- Art. 5
Adjustment of assessments
- ¹ Assessments can be cancelled or postponed. In the event of a postponement, the students must be informed in writing one week in advance.
- ² Course assessments of a module can be adjustment (number, type, mode) by the director of studies. In case of adjustment students must be informed in writing one week in advance of a adjusted or new assessment.
- ³ In the case of oral examinations, the involvement of an expert can be waived if the oral performance can be proven by the examiners in another suitable form.
- ⁴ If the course assessments of modules are adjusted, students can withdraw from the module in question without consequences.

III. Examination procedure

- Art. 6
Extension of the de-registration period
- ¹ In deviation to the Study and Examination Regulations art. 16 para. 3: Students can de-register from a module prior to start of the examination weeks according to the university calendar. This also applies to re-examinations.
- Art. 7
Annulment of failed modules
- ¹ Unsatisfactory or failed modules in the spring semester 2020 are not counted with regard to the number of possible repetitions: If a module is not passed, this failed attempt will be annulled regarding the number of times a module can be repeated. This applies regardless of whether it is a first or a second attempt (re-examination). Annulment is not possible for modules that have been passed, for a Bachelor's or Master's thesis that has not been passed, for an unexcused failure to attend a course, for deception or plagiarism or for non-recognition due to disciplinary proceedings.
- Art. 8
Repetition of failed modules
- ¹ In case of a repetition of an annulled module, all course assessment of the module must be repeated.

IV. Final provisions

Art. 9
Entry into force

¹ These regulations come into force as of 7 September 2020. The regulations replace the Regulations for study programmes and examinations in extraordinary situations from 7 April 2020.

Art. 10
Extension

¹ The University Executive Board may extend the regulations by a maximum of one semester to the spring semester 2021 for the period 22 February 2021 to 18 September 2021. The University Executive Board will inform the members of the university about an extension immediately.

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
